her spare time, she was a volunteer at Last Chance Ranch Animal Rescue which she continued throughout college.

For college, Dr. Mick attended Drexel University where she earned her bachelor of science degree in biology. She carried the Gwynedd spirit with her by joining the Newman Center (Drexel's Catholic group on campus) and continuing to lead small groups, service opportunities, and a retreat. She became President of the Drexel Pre-Veterinary Medical Association and joined the Biology Honors Society. On weekends, in addition to adventuring in Philadelphia, she worked as a veterinary assistant.

After graduation from Drexel in 2016, Dr. Mick attended the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine where she obtained her Veterinariae Medicinae Doctoris (VMD) in 2020. Currently, she works as an associate veterinarian for small and exotic animals at Dublin Veterinary Hospital in Perkasie, PA. Her areas of professional interest include exotics, behavior, hospice and palliative care. Being a veterinarian allows her to combine all three of her passions: a strong interest in medicine, a passion for animals, and a love for helping people.

Dr. Mick currently lives in Philadelphia, PA with her rescue pets, including a cat, turtles, axolotl, iguana, and hermit crabs. When she is not practicing veterinary medicine, she enjoys exploring Philly, trying new restaurants, playing piano, and going to zoos and aquariums.

Rebecca Roque, 2016

Neuroscience biomedical research technician working at the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania

Rebecca graduated from Mary Mother of the Redeemer grade school in June of 2012. She then continued her journey at Gwynedd Mercy Academy High School the following fall. It was there she took part in Latin Club, Mathletes, Glee Club, Art Club, majored in Art, took part in the school play from her freshman year until junior year, a track and field sprinter and pole vaulter, and was founder and first president of the Ski Club in 2016. While she enjoyed indulging in many after school activities, she found her true passion in her senior year honors anatomy and honors

psychology courses. This helped propel her into a career of neuroscience.

In the fall of 2016, Rebecca continued her journey at Saint Joseph's University. There she majored in Psychology and double minored in English and Behavioral Neuroscience, while additionally taking a pre-medical track. As she excelled in her neuroscience courses she was recruited to work as a biomedical research assistant at the Granato Lab, a neuroscience lab at the University of Pennsylvania. With the help of her mentors she was able to begin the process of co-authoring an axon development research paper, which is currently under review. At Saint Joe's, Rebecca was a member of the Adventure club and a guest writer for the school newspaper, The Hawk. She also had the privilege to become a primary caregiver to a cancer patient with comorbidities. This experience helped solidify her resolve to earn an MD PhD. She is now currently enrolled in ACHS pre-medical post baccalaureate program at Temple University.

During her neuroscience-capstone at Saint Joe's, she developed a research project testing the eating habits of rats by lesioning their lateral hypothalami via stereotactic neurosurgery. Designing her own research project presented a myriad of challenges that forced her to become an adaptive and resilient scientist.

Since graduating in May 2020, she has been continuing her role working full time as a biomedical research technician in the Granato Lab at Penn. Broadly, in the Granato Lab, they study mechanisms of axon guidance during development and regeneration, using larval zebrafish as a model system. Rebecca and her colleague discovered large swellings, later identified as neuromuscular junctions, in the motor innervation pattern of Lrp4 and agrin mutant larval zebrafish pectoral fins, likely caused by the over expression of musk. She will be second author for this work, currently in preparation (Walker, Roque, et al).

Ava Scarpato, GMA Class of 2017Graduate Student at the University of Pittsburgh Located in North Wales, PA

Ava started her academic career at Mary, Mother of the Redeemer grade school and later attended the wonderful Gwynedd Mercy Academy High School, where she was involved in ministry and service, art club, photography club, health club and track and field. All of those activities inspired her passion for nutrition as they fostered a sense of creativity, while emphasizing the importance of helping others achieve better health.



Ava later attended the University of Pittsburgh studying in their Dietitian Nutritionist Accelerated Bachelor's/Master's 5-year program, where she graduated in 2021 with a degree in Nutrition Science. Ava was involved in Greek life as a sister of Kappa Delta Xi Chapter sorority and stood as the volunteer chair for the Student Dietetic Association. Now, Ava is preparing for her last year in graduate school at the University of Pittsburgh where she will be spending her time in nutrition-focused clinical and community rotations within the realm of maternal and pediatric nutrition at Magee Women's Hospital and The Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh. Recently, Ava was named student liaison for the National Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics Women's Dietetic Practice Group. What she loves about the field of nutrition is the ability to help people discover a healthier and more enjoyable lifestyle that involves a physical and mental approach to food.
